Dear Church Family,

There's a song we used to sing in church that goes like this:

"Holiness, holiness is what I long for. Holiness is what I need. Holiness, holiness is what you want from me."*

As the song continues, the noun changes each verse: it names holiness, then righteousness, then faithfulness. When I was a little girl, I associated each of those words with a certain consistency that demanded severity. I understood holiness as perfection, righteousness as infallibility, and faithfulness as rigid devotion. I imagined I was covered in filth, and I needed to be roughly scrubbed clean.

Because the song is so repetitive, even decades later, it still gets stuck in my head. But, recently, in a moment of clarity I can only credit to the Holy Spirit, the tune stayed the same in my brain, but the lyrics changed.

"Gentleness. Gentleness is what I long for. Gentleness is what I need. Gentleness, gentleness is what God gives to me."

I wanted to share that epiphany with you as we approach the beginning of Lent.

It's only two weeks until Ash Wednesday, the start of the Lenten season. In previous years, you may have used the time leading up to Lent to think about what you "should" give up or what you "should" add in to set apart the season. Indeed, the 40 days* between February 14th and March 31st could be covered with "shoulds" that I believe would bring us closer to guilt, not closer to God. Instead, this year, I pray that we might find this season overflowing with what we need.

Job Description for Half-time Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Richmond, Indiana

Primary Responsibilities

The pastor will:

- be responsible for Sunday bulletin writing/compilation
- be responsible for Sunday sermon writing/preaching
- be responsible for baptism, communion, funerals and weddings
- attend Presbytery meetings
- moderate Session meetings/congregational meetings
- maintain office hours for 6 hours for a set day per week
- provide pastoral care to those homebound, hospitalized, sick, or in need of a pastoral visit (This may be used in conjunction with office hours.)

-facilitate back up pastoral care system in case of emergencies

Secondary Responsibilities*

The pastor will:

- provide pastoral care to those attending Dinner at the Lamp, the weekly free community meal

- attend church fellowship events
- teach a seasonal Bible Study
- teach a seasonal Sunday School class
- attend monthly Richmond Area Ministerial Association meetings
- write an article for the church newsletter

- attend a designated portion of monthly commission meetings/deacon meetings upon prior invitation from the commission chair/lead deacon

- be responsible for up to two "extra" services during Advent and up to two "extra" services during Lent

- provide additional support as necessary
